

Alaska Youth Essay Contest

Why do you want to become an Alaskan Wildlife biologist, Wildlife Trooper or Alaskan Hunting Guide?

Open to Alaskan Youth Ages 13-18

Deadline: October 1, 2018



Essays should describe/incorporate a passion for hunting, wilderness and wildlife in Alaska. They should be on the subject of why you want to become a "wildlife biologist, wildlife trooper, or Alaskan hunting guide".

Contestants should use a traditional 5 paragraph essay format. Essays shorter or longer than 5 paragraphs and 400-500 words will be disqualified. Essays should be double-spaced and submitted in PDF format, via email, with the subject "youth essay submission" and must be received by the APHA at office@alaskaprohunter.org no later then October 1, 2017.

Essays will be reviewed by a 5 member panel. The panel will consist of at least two APHA board members and at least one APHA member at large. Essays are scored on a five point scale, addressing the following categories:





- 1. Knowledge of Wildlife
 - 2. Passion for hunting
- 3. Understanding of wildlife conservation
 - 4. Creativity

1st Place: 4 night conservation based stay at The Rainy Pass Lodge with one parent, recognition in APHA magazine, 2 dream hunt raffle tickets, airfare for winner and two adults plus 1 night hotel and tickets to attend APHA annual banquet. on December 8, 2018
